Coriander prefers light, well-draining soils with significant organic matter.

They adapt to any type of soil and do not like excessive water or extreme dryness.

History

Its origin is uncertain, however it is said that the ancient Egyptians already used this plant to embalm bodies.

In the Middle Ages it was cultivated in gardens and monasteries.

Utilization

In cooking, it is widely used in Alentejo in açordas, soups and pork.
