

Pennyroyal

Mentha pulegium



Lamiaceae family, is a perennial plant with erect and quadrangular stems, branched, which can measure between 30 to 40 cm.

It leaves are lance-shaped and green and have small pink flowers.

Cultivation

It grows in moist soils, rich in organic matter and in temperate climate, with light but no direct sunlight.

It should be planted in spring or fall.

It is common to find it along the watercourses.

History

Plant known for centuries throughout the Mediterranean and western Asia for its carminative and relaxing properties.

The pulegium term derives from the word pulex (Latin) which means flea, is due to the ancient custom of burning pennyroyal inside the houses to repel these insects.

Curiosity: The Nirvana band has a song called "Pennyroyal Tea".

Utilization

In Portugal it is widely used in cooking (traditional Alentejo cuisine) in infusions and also for liquor manufacturing (mainly in the south).



The pennyroyal is expetorante (against the flu symptoms and chronic cough). It is also a tranquilizer for the nervous system, helps fight insomnia, rheumatic pains, stomach acid fermentation, nausea, bronchitis and asthma.

The pennyroyal used in inaccurate dosages during pregnancy can have an abortive effect.
